SHAC Activity Report:

- Wellness Plan and Bylaws Reviewed and no changes recommended.
- The number of students eating in the cafeteria this year had a daily average of 541 for breakfast and 903 for lunch.
- Sponsored Flu Clinic provided by The Apothecary and Hometown Pharmacy on 9/27/22.
- The School District did not perform any COVID 10 texting this past year. The District did not provide COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic this past year.
- The District had total of 27 COVID-19 cases reported and a total of 62 Flu cases reported for the 2022-2023 School year.
- Aim for Success Programs:

The Secondary School presented the Aim for Success program, Focus on Success, to our students on Friday, April 14, 2023. Covering "the risks and rewards of technology".

Due to new Texas State Law, HB1525, districts are REQUIRED to obtain written consent for students to attend the any programs covering sexual awareness. This changed from the earlier "opt out" permission form that required the parent to send the form back only if they did not want the student to attend.

All parents were invited to a ZOOM presentation by the speaker, which previewed the program so that parents had an option to discuss and view the presentation.
